Storyteller Children's Center Volunteer Policies

Children are our first priority. Volunteers must be considerate of the varied religious values and ethnic backgrounds of Storyteller's children. All persons' civil rights shall be upheld. Families have a right to privacy and volunteers must be considerate of it. We have a commitment to our schedule and volunteers must call if they cannot meet the schedule (i.e. other commitment or illness) in a timely manner. Volunteers must sign a Daily Volunteer Time Sheet and fill out a Volunteer Application. School cleanliness and maintenance must be maintained for the safety and well-being of the children and staff. Volunteers must follow the cleaning procedures for the various areas in the school. If the facility or a piece of equipment needs maintenance, volunteers shall notify the Storyteller Volunteer Coordinator.
